



EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS OFFERED BY CENTRAL BROWARD WATER CONTROL DISTRICT

1) “Wetlands” Presentation

District outreach provides an hour-long classroom presentation that focuses on the basic values and functions of wetlands, and uncovers some of the most common threats to wetlands. A hands-on demonstration using the Enviroscape model (allowing for active student participation) helps illustrate why wetlands are so important and how our activities and behaviors can affect them. Also covered are ways that we can help protect wetlands and our water resources. Incentives for students are provided along with a written follow-up activity relevant to the subject.

2) “Water Pollution & Our Watershed” Presentation

District outreach provides an hour-long classroom presentation that focuses on the various sources of and problems associated with surface water pollution. A hands-on demonstration using the Enviroscape model (allowing for active student participation) helps illustrate how water pollution occurs in our communities, and shows ways that we can help prevent its occurrence. Incentives for students are provided along with a written follow-up activity relevant to the subject.

These programs are presented at no cost to public and private schools located within the District’s boundaries. Approved by Broward County Schools, they are \ part of the District’s outreach effort to educate the community about ways to conserve and protect our most precious natural resource: WATER.
